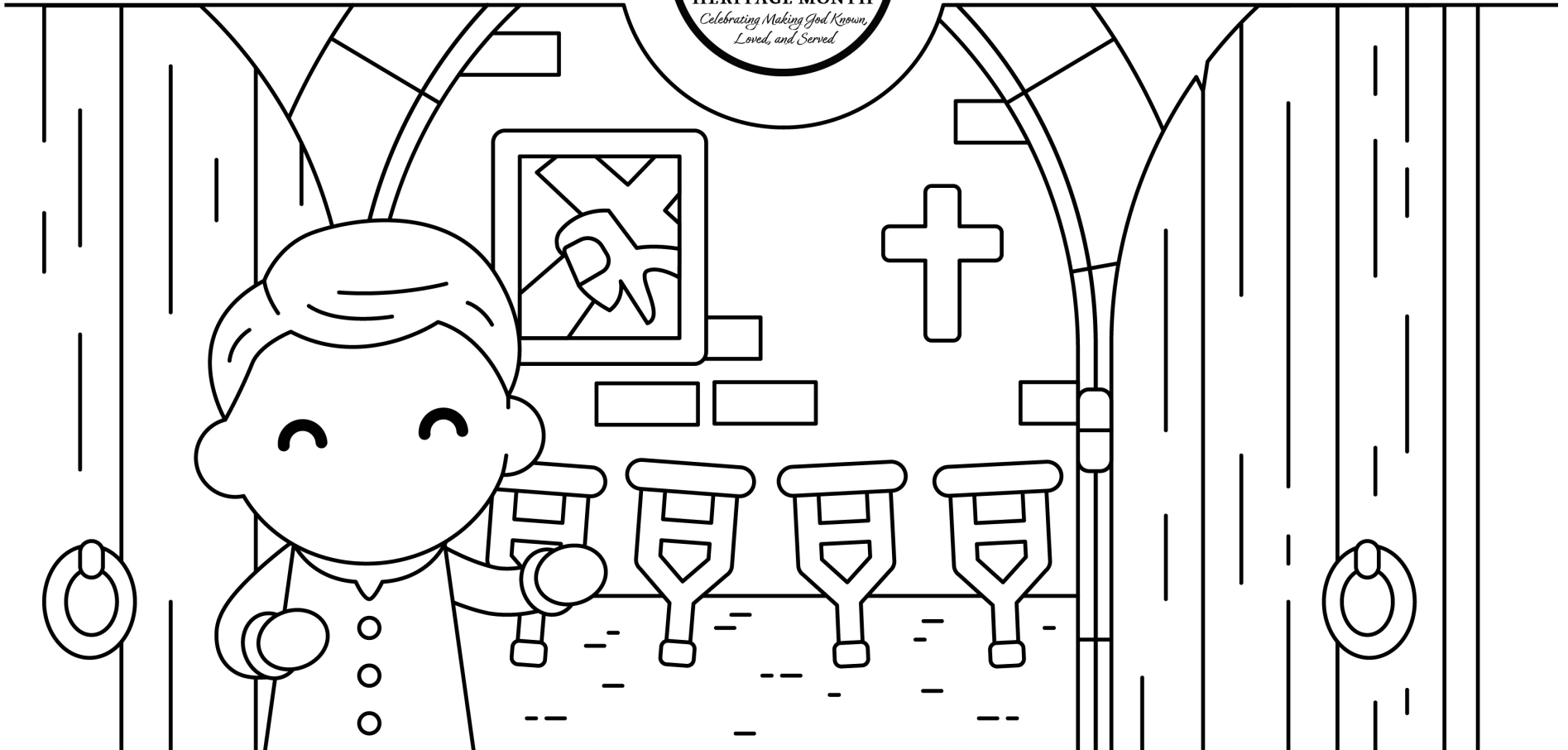

Brother André Bessette, C.S.C., was a humble doorkeeper whose prayers to Saint Joseph brought about thousands of cures and miracles. To this day, crutches used by the miraculously healed line the walls of his beloved oratory. Through his dedication, he founded the largest shrine to Saint Joseph in Montréal, Canada, and was canonized on October 17, 2010. His feast day is January 6th.

BLESSED BASIL MOREAU

Dedicated to restoring the Church in the wake of the French Revolution, Blessed Father Basil Moreau, C.S.C., was a deeply spiritual leader who wanted to prepare the world for better times. Moreau envisioned a community of priests, brothers, sisters, and lay people collaborating in ministry. Father Moreau founded the Congregation of Holy Cross and the Marianites of Holy Cross which sponsors schools, parishes, and missions worldwide, united by the motto: Ave Crux, Spes Unica ("Hail the Cross, Our Only Hope").

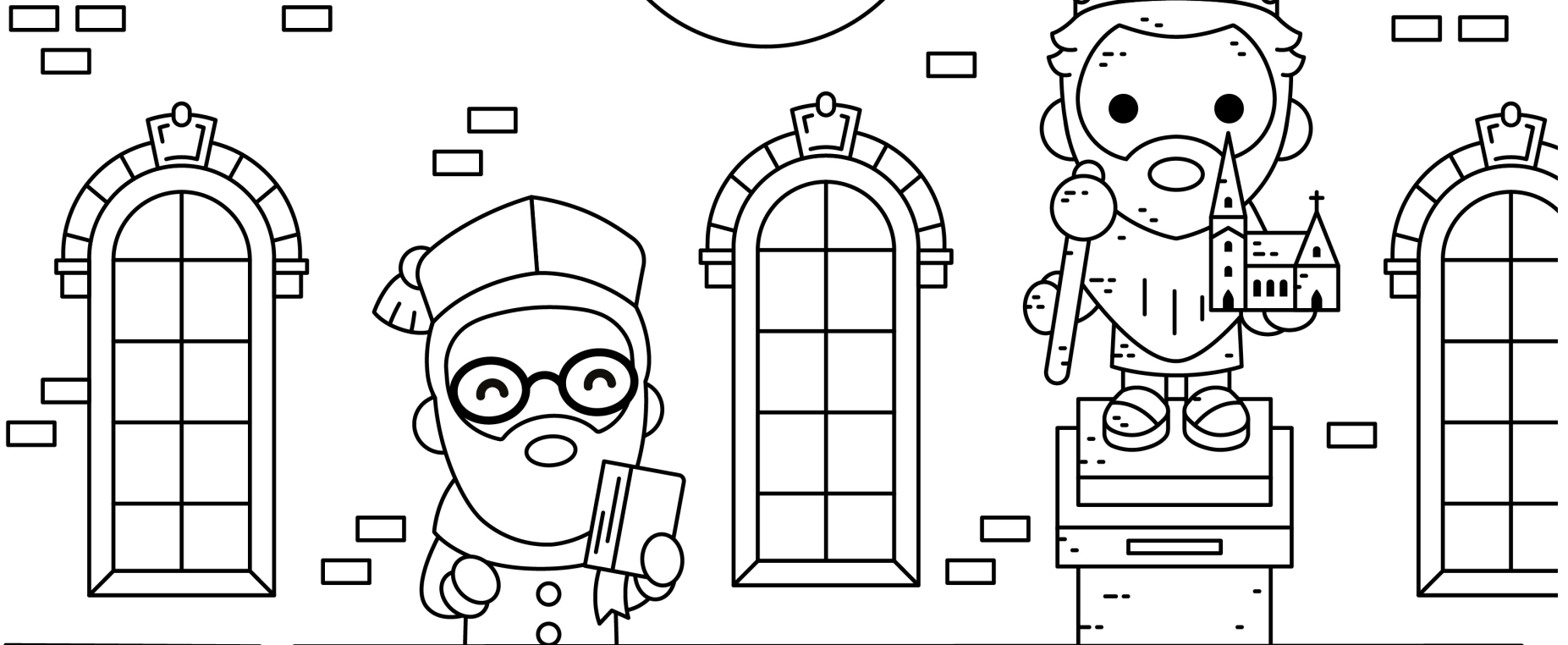


Sevant of God Brother Columba O'Neill, C.S.C., was a Holy Cross brother who served the students of the University of Notre Dame as their cobbler and shoemaker. Known for his humility and devotion to the Sacred Heart, he earned a reputation as a healer and the Miracle Man of Notre Dame in the early 1900s, taking no credit for the cures, but claiming they were the result of his "intercession to the Sacred Heart of Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of Mary."

FATHER EDWARD SORIN

Known best for founding the University of Notre Dame in 1842, Father Edward Sorin, C.S.C., was a Holy Cross priest whose devotion to the Blessed Mother and vision for education and faith have endured. His legacy has produced a world-renowned Catholic institution and fostered generations of leaders grounded in faith, service, and learning. Born in France, but committed to the ideals of democracy, Fr. Sorin was dedicated to serving the Church in the United States. He also founded Saint Edward's University in Texas, Ave Maria Press, and other parishes across Indiana to Texas, and beyond.

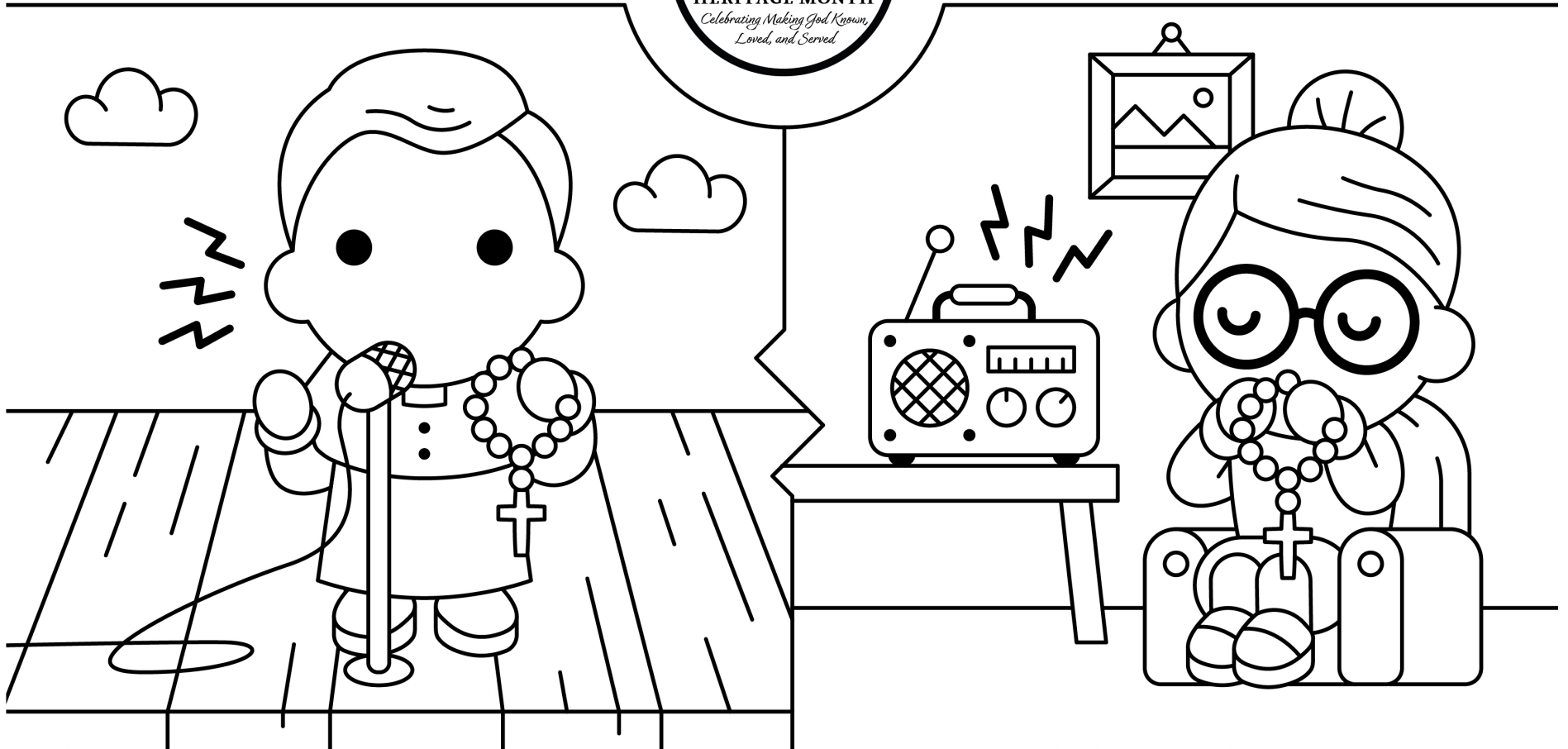


Ordained in secret during the French Revolution, Father Jacques Dujarie assisted priests who were ministering "underground" in rural France during the most dangerous period of the revolution for Catholic priests, even disguising himself as a lemonade salesman to avoid being arrested. In France, he founded the Sisters of Providence, the community of St. Mother Theodora Guérin, and the Brothers of Saint Joseph before entrusting the care of the Brothers to Blessed Basil Moreau, C.S.C., who founded the Congregation of Holy Cross.

Father Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., was a Holy Cross priest who dedicated his life to promoting family prayer and devotion to Mary, especially through the Rosary. Born in Ireland, Father Peyton was an active and prominent public figure in the United States and around the world, he became well-known for the message: "The Family That Prays Together Stays Together".
